Motorcycle for Kenyan Street Children Rescue Center

It's finally arrived! Over a year ago, Servant sent \$1,800 for a motor bike to bring children from the streets of Maua to a rural rescue center. The center opened in April 2016 and the motor bike just arrived in January 2017. It was worth waiting for! It's sturdy, large, and can handle the rough roads. Stanley Gitari, Community Outreach Director for Maua Methodist Hospital, wrote in an email, "We are happy dancing, finally we have received the motor bike for the rescue center. I have no better words to express our gratitude for this kind and generous donation to the center."

Stanley continues, "There are currently 20 staff members – social workers, farmers, cooks, house parents, and teachers – who work with children who have moved to our residential facility. We also have staff members who teach positive parenting, conflict resolution and effective communication, and economic strengthening (self-help groups). This outreach is run by leaders of the Methodist Church of Kenya and Maua Methodist Hospital."

As individuals, we may not feel personally connected to Maua Methodist Hospital and its community outreach programs, but there is no doubt that they feel a personal connection to Church of the Servant!


It's Time for Hearts and Flowers!

Tenaciously Teal

Women's Ministry began the New Year by serving others at the annual "New You, New You" event. Tarah Warren, founder of the nonprofit Tenaciously Teal, spoke about her battle with ovarian cancer and her ministry of encouragement to cancer fighters. Her message of encouraging others even in the midst of your own struggles was inspiring. Dr. Robyn Goggs said, "Tarah's story showed me how, even in the depths of despair, God doesn't give up on us and continues to point us to our calling to serve his kingdom."

As Tarah was undergoing chemotherapy, she felt God asking her, "You know of the suffering of many, will you continue to be a catalyst for showing my love to those who are hurting?" She began bringing cancer packs containing simple items including Gatorade, protein bars, hand sanitizer, lotion, Kleenex, journals, green tea, crossword puzzles/word finds, chapstick, and cozy men's and women's socks to encourage her fellow patients and make them more comfortable. A ministry was born as God has continued to use Tarah's acts of kindness to form a network of support for cancer fighters who need encouragement and a reminder of God's love.

Tenaciously Teal volunteers have delivered over 6,300 care packs to cancer fighters at 15 treatment centers in Oklahoma. They are also mailed nationwide by request.




